What are Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders (FASD)?

Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders is an umbrella term used to describe disorders that result from alcohol exposure during pregnancy.

Are there behaviors I may notice?

Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders refers to a range of effects that can occur in a person who was exposed to alcohol during pregnancy. Exposure to alcohol during pregnancy can cause the baby to have conditions that can create lifelong problems:

- Difficulty learning and remembering new information
- Difficulty learning from mistakes
- Self-regulation difficulties including temper tantrums, anger, rigidity
- Difficulty understanding social cues / body language
- Excessive friendliness with strangers
- Need for close supervision
